#### 192. Dr. Banda Prakash:

- (a) whether Government has allocated any funds to the States for labour and self employment groups and others under different schemes like Atmanirbhar Bharat;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, State/UT-wise; and
- (c) if not, the reasons therefor?

# ANSWER THE MINISTRY OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI ANURAG SINGH THAKUR)

(a) to (c): Government has made a provision of Rs. 40,000 crore under MGNREGA scheme through Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan to provide employment to the needy workers, in addition to allocation of Rs. 61,500 crore under MGNREGA for Financial Year 2020-21.

Under the Pradhan Mantri Gareeb Kalyan Yojna (PMGKY), Government paid 12% employers' share and 12% employees' share under Employees' Provident Fund (EPF), totalling 24% for three wage months from March to May, 2020 for all the establishments having up to 100 employees with 90% of such employees earning less than Rs. 15,000 monthly wage. The package was extended for another 3 wage months i.e., for the wage months of June to August, 2020 under the Aatmanirbhar Bharat.

Further, funds for self employed groups has been provided under the National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM).

#### **ANSWER**

## MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

(a) to (c): The Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) on employment and unemployment is conducted by National Statistical Office (NSO), Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation on annual basis. As per PLFS 2018-19, the estimated unemployment rate to the extent available based on such survey for persons of all ages on usual status (principal status + subsidiary status) basis in the country was 5.8%. Further, the global spread of the corona virus (COVID-19) followed by lockdowns has affected economies across the globe including India. COVID-19 has resulted in large number of migrant workers going back to their native places.

(a) to (c): A Statement indicating details of the Aatma Nirbhar Package and the sectors covered therein is at **Annexure-I**. The package contains schemes/programmes concerning various Ministries/Departments and the concerned Ministries/Departments have been tasked to implement the schemes/programmes/policies concerning them. The targeted stimulus for a particular announcement, wherever applicable, is mentioned against the announcement, as placed at **Annexure-I**.

An Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme has also been announced on 23.5.2020 which provides support to eligible MSMEs and business enterprises in meeting their operational liabilities and re-starting the business after disruption caused by COVID-19. National Credit Guarantee Trustee Company Ltd (NCGTC) provides 100% credit guarantee on the loans under the scheme. Guarantees of a total loan amount of Rs. 1,19,516.69 crores has been issued to Member Lending Institutions (MLIs). A statement indicating MLI wise details of guarantees issued is at **Annexure-II**.

The Government has also announced a Rs 1.70 Lakh Crore relief under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana for the poor to help them fight the battle against Corona Virus. Statements indicating benefits provided under it are at **Annexure-III (a) & III(b)**.

1009: SHRI K.C. VENUGOPAL:

Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

- a) the number of stimulus financial packages declared by Government during the lockdown and COVID-19 crisis;
- b) the details of financial packages declared so far; and
- c) how much funds under the package have been distributed to various States including Rajasthan and Kerala so far?

# ANSWER MINISTER OF STATE (FINANCE) (SHRI ANURAG SINGH THAKUR)

(a) to (b): The Government has announced a Rs 1.70 Lakh Crore relief under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana for the poor to help them fight the battle against Corona Virus on 26.03.2020 and a Special economic and comprehensive package called Aatma Nirbhar Bharat Package of Rs. 20 lakh crores equivalent to 10% of India's GDP — to fight COVID-19 pandemic in India on 12.05.2020. Statements indicating details of the Pradhan Mantri Gariba Kalyan Yojana and the Aatma Nirbhar Package are at Annexure-II respectively.

Aatma Nirbhar Package comprises of various schemes/programmes/policy measures announced with the intent of making the country self-reliant. The schemes/programmes are being implemented by various Ministries/Departments and the outlay announced for each scheme/programme, wherever applicable, has been mentioned against the scheme/programme in **Annexure-II** 

(c): A total of INR 68,820 crores have been done as cash transfers to eligible persons of States/UTs including Kerala and Rajasthan under various components of PMGKP as on 7.9.2020. Further, 178.85 Lakh MT of food-grains and 6.82 Lakh MT of pulses have been distributed free of cost to approx. 75 crores beneficiaries under NFSA and this scheme will continue till November 2020. Statements indicating State-wise benefits granted are at **Annexure-III**.

#### **Details of PMGKY**

## I. Insurance scheme for health workers fighting COVID-19 in Government Hospitals and Health Care Centres

An Insurance Scheme for Health Workers Fighting COVID-19' was launched w.e.f. 30.03.2020 to provide comprehensive personal accident cover of Rs. 50 lakh to around 22.12 lakh public healthcare providers, including community health workers, who may have to be in direct contact and care of COVID-19 patients and who may be at risk of being impacted by this. The scheme was initially for 90 days w.e.f. 30.03.2020 and has now been extended by another 90 days. On account of the unprecedented situation, private hospital staff/ retired/volunteer/ local urban bodies/contract/daily wage/ adhoc/outsourced staff requisitioned by States/ Central hospitals/autonomous hospitals of Central/States/UTs, AlIMS & INIs/ hospitals of Central Ministries can also be drafted for COVID19 related responsibilities. These cases are also covered under the scheme.

#### II. PM Garib Kalyan Ann Yojana

Under the scheme, additional allocation of food grain @ 5 kg per person per month free of cost is provided to all the beneficiaries covered under the targeted public distribution system (Antryodaya Anna Yojana & Priority Households) including those covered under Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) for a period of three months i.e. April to June, 2020. About 119.32 LMT of food grains were allotted to approximately 80.96 crore beneficiaries entailing a financial implication of Rs.46061 crore. The scheme has been extended till November, 2020 (5 months) with additional allocation of foodgrain of 202.749 LMT for approx 81.09 crore beneficiaries entailing a food subsidy of Rs.76062.11 crore. Further, Pulses according to regional preferences @ 1 kg per family were provided for three months, free of cost. The scheme has been extended till November, 2020.

#### III. Benefit to farmers:

The first installment of Rs 2,000 due in 2020-21 was front-loaded and paid in April 2020 itself under the PM KISAN Yojana, covering about 8.7 crore farmers

#### IV. Cash transfers-

- a) Help to Poor: A total of 20.40 crores (approx) PMJDY women account-holders were given an ex-gratia of Rs 500 per month for next three months.
- b) Gas cylinders: A schemes to provide for free of cost LPG cylinders for three months to 8 crore beneficiaries of Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) was started under PMGKP w.e.f. 01.04.2020 with a budgetary support of 13000 crore. Cash advances for buying the cylinders were transferred to the bank account of the beneficiaries. The scheme has been extended till September 30, 2020 for those beneficiaries who have been credited with the advance for buying refills, but have not been able to buy the free cylinders till 30.06.2020. OMCs have delivered 1321.59 lakh refills to PMUY beneficiaries under this scheme as on 06.09.2020.
- c) Help to low wage earners in organised sectors: Wage-earners, earning below Rs 15,000 per month, in businesses having less than 100 workers, were provided Twenty four (24) percent of

- the monthly wages into their PF accounts, for the next three months to prevent disruption in their employment. The scheme has been extended for another three months, i.e., till August 2020
- d) Support for senior citizens (above 60 years), widows and Divyang: An amount of Rs.1000/- per month for three months to around 3 crore aged widows and people in Divyang category was provided.

#### V. MNREGA

MNREGA wages were increased by Rs 20 with effect from 1 April, 2020. This wage increase was estimated to provide an additional Rs 2,000 benefit annually to a worker and benefit approximately 13.62 crore families.

V. Self-Help groups: Limit of collateral free lending was increased from Rs 10 to Rs 20 lakhs for women organized through 63 lakhs Self Help Groups (SHGs), who support 6.85 crore households.

#### VI. Other components of PM Garib Kalyan package

- (a) Organised sector: Employees' Provident Fund Regulations was amended to include Pandemic as the reason to allow non-refundable advance of 75 percent of the amount or three months of the wages, whichever is lower, from their accounts. Families of four crore workers registered under EPF can take benefit of this window.
- (b) Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Fund: Welfare Fund for Building and Other Constructions Workers has been created under a Central Government Act. There are around 3.5 Crore registered workers in the Fund. State Governments were directed to utilise this fund to provide assistance and support to these workers to protect them against economic disruptions.
- (c) District Mineral Fund: The State Government were asked to utilise the funds available under District Mineral Fund (DMF) for supplementing and augmenting facilities of medical testing, screening and other requirements in connection with preventing the spread of CVID-19 pandemic as well as treating the patients affected with this pandemic.

- b) the quantum of funds of said COVID package with respect to GDP in terms of the percentage; and
- c) total funds released in terms of percentage for farmers, labourers and MSMEs under said COVID package and expenditure thereon; the details thereof?

# ANSWER MINISTER OF STATE (FINANCE) (SHRI ANURAG SINGH THAKUR)

(a) to (c): The Government had announced a Rs 1.70 Lakh Crore relief package under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana for the poor to help them fight the battle against Corona Virus. The details of the package are at Annexure-I. The Government has also announced a Special economic and comprehensive package of Rs. 20 lakh crores - equivalent to 10% of India's GDP — to fight COVID-19 pandemic in India, called Aatma Nirbhar Bharat Package on 12.05.2020. The package comprises of various schemes/programmes/policy measures announced with the intent of making the country self-reliant. These are mostly long-term measures and the outcomes will be visible in due course. The details of the package are at Annexure-II.

A total of INR 68,820 crores have been given as cash transfers to eligible persons of States/UTs under various components of Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana as on 7.9.2020. Further, 178.85 Lakh MT of food-grains and 6.82 Lakh MT of pulses have been distributed, so far, free of cost to approx. 75 crores beneficiaries under NFSA and this scheme was further extended till November 2020. Additional expected expenditure on account of the extension is 82,911 cr. Further, 1321.59 lakh free gas cylinders have been given to PMUY beneficiaries under this scheme as on 06.09.2020

A release of Rs.11092 crore was made by Ministry of Home Affairs from the State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) to the States in advance on 03.04.2020.

An amount of Rs.1113.21 crore has been released by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare under NHM for management and containment of COVID 19 pandemic. Further, an amount of Rs.4256.79 crore has

been released to States/UTs in FY 2020-21 by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare under the COVID Emergency Response and Health System Preparedness Package.

Aatma Nirbhar Package comprises of various schemes/programmes/policy measures announced with the intent of making the country self-reliant. The schemes/programmes are being implemented by various Ministries/Departments. The targeted stimulus announced for each scheme/programme, wherever applicable, has been mentioned against each of the schemes announced under the package.

For farmers, besides front-loading of payment of the first instalment of PM-KISAN under PMGKP, measures such as Rs 30,000 Crore Additional Emergency Working Capital for farmers through NABARD,Rs 2 lakh Crore concessional credit boost to 2.5 Crore farmers under Kisan Credit Card, Rs 1 lakh crore Agri Infrastructure Fund for farm-gate infrastructure for farmers, Rs 10,000 Crore scheme for formalisation of Micro Food Enterprises (MFE) etc were also announced.

Similarly, for MSMEs an Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme to provide support to eligible MSMEs and business enterprises in meeting their operational expenses and re-starting their business after disruption caused by COVID-19, Employees Provident Fund Support for business and organised workers, reduction of EPF contribution for employers and employees for from 12% to 10% etc were taken.

For labour, free food supply for migrant labour was given and Scheme for Affordable Rental Housing Complexes for Migrant Workers and Urban Poor was launched. Further, An additional provision of Rs.40,000 Crore has been made under MGNREGA for the F.Y. 2020-21 raising the total allocation under MGNREGA to Rs.1,01,500 Crore to provide work to retuning migrants

#### **Details of PMGKY**

 Insurance scheme for health workers fighting COVID-19 in Government Hospitals and Health Care Centres

An Insurance Scheme for Health Workers Fighting COVID-19' was launched w.e.f. 30.03.2020 to provide comprehensive personal accident cover of Rs. 50 lakh to around 22.12 lakh public healthcare providers, including community health workers, who may have to be in direct contact and care of COVID-19 patients and who may be at risk of being impacted by this. The scheme was initially for 90 days w.e.f. 30.03.2020 and has now been extended by another 90 days. On account of the unprecedented situation, private hospital staff/ retired/volunteer/ local urban bodies/contract/daily wage/ adhoc/outsourced staff requisitioned by States/ Central hospitals/autonomous hospitals of Central/States/UTs, AIIMS & INIs/ hospitals of Central Ministries can also be drafted for COVID19 related responsibilities. These cases are also covered under the scheme.

#### II. PM Garib Kalyan Ann Yojana

Under the scheme, additional allocation of food grain @ 5 kg per person per month free of cost is provided to all the beneficiaries covered under the targeted public distribution system (Antryodaya Anna Yojana & Priority Households) including those covered under Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) for a period of three months i.e. April to June, 2020. About 119.32 LMT of food grains were allotted to approximately 80.96 crore beneficiaries entailing a financial implication of Rs.46061 crore. The scheme has been extended till November, 2020 (5 months) with additional allocation of foodgrain of 202.749 LMT for approx 81.09 crore beneficiaries entailing a food subsidy of Rs.76062.11 crore. Further, Pulses according to regional preferences @ 1 kg per family were provided for three months, free of cost. The scheme has been extended till November, 2020.

#### III. Benefit to farmers:

The first installment of Rs 2,000 due in 2020-21 was front-loaded and paid in April 2020 itself under the PM KISAN Yojana, covering about 8.7 crore farmers

#### IV. Cash transfers-

- a) Help to Poor: A total of 20.40 crores (approx) PMJDY women account-holders were given an exgratia of Rs 500 per month for next three months.
- b) Gas cylinders: A schemes to provide for free of cost LPG cylinders for three months to 8 crore beneficiaries of Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) was started under PMGKP w.e.f. 01.04.2020 with a budgetary support of 13000 crore. Cash advances for buying the cylinders were transferred to the bank account of the beneficiaries. The scheme has been extended till September 30, 2020 for those beneficiaries who have been credited with the advance for buying refills, but have not been able to buy the free cylinders till 30.06.2020. OMCs have delivered 1321.59 lakh refills to PMUY beneficiaries under this scheme as on 06.09.2020.

- c) Help to low wage earners in organised sectors: Wage-earners, earning below Rs 15,000 per month, in businesses having less than 100 workers, were provided Twenty four (24) percent of the monthly wages into their PF accounts, for the next three months to prevent disruption in their employment. The scheme has been extended for another three months, i.e., till August 2020.
- d) Support for senior citizens (above 60 years), widows and Divyang: An amount of Rs.1000/- per month for three months to around 3 crore aged widows and people in Divyang category was provided.

#### V. MNREGA

MNREGA wages were increased by Rs 20 with effect from 1 April, 2020. This wage increase was estimated to provide an additional Rs 2,000 benefit annually to a worker and benefit approximately 13.62 crore families.

- V. Self-Help groups: Limit of collateral free lending was increased from Rs 10 to Rs 20 lakhs for women organized through 63 lakhs Self Help Groups (SHGs), who support 6.85 crore households.
- VI. Other components of PM Garib Kalyan package
  - (a) Organised sector: Employees' Provident Fund Regulations was amended to include Pandemic as the reason to allow non-refundable advance of 75 percent of the amount or three months of the wages, whichever is lower, from their accounts. Families of four crore workers registered under EPF can take benefit of this window.
  - (b) Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Fund: Welfare Fund for Building and Other Constructions Workers has been created under a Central Government Act. There are around 3.5 Crore registered workers in the Fund. State Governments were directed to utilise this fund to provide assistance and support to these workers to protect them against economic disruptions.
  - (c) District Mineral Fund: The State Government were asked to utilise the funds available under District Mineral Fund (DMF) for supplementing and augmenting facilities of medical testing, screening and other requirements in connection with preventing the spread of CVID-19 pandemic as well as treating the patients affected with this pandemic.

#### **GENERATION OF EMPLOYMENT DURING LOCKDOWN PERIOD**

1206. DR. VINAY P. SAHASRABUDDHE:

Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) what steps have been taken by the Ministry to provide employment opportunities to people, during the last five months since the nationwide lockdown;
- (b) if so, what is the amount spent by the Ministry for the same, State-wise details thereof; and
- (c) whether any employment has been generated ever since Unlock 1.0, if so, the details thereof?

#### **ANSWER**

## MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

(a) to (c): The global spread of the corona virus (COVID-19) followed by lockdowns has affected economies across the globe, including India. Covid-19 has resulted in large number of migrant workers going back to their native places. Central Government has announced an economic package of Rupees 20 lakh crore and has advocated for Atmanirbhar Bharat. Atmanirbhar Bharat is based on Economy, Infrastructure, System, Vibrant Demography and Demand to create jobs for the youth.

Under Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana (PMGKY), Government of India is contributing both 12% employer's share and 12% employee's share under Employees Provident Fund (EPF), totalling 24% of the wage for the wage month from March to August, 2020 for all the establishments having upto 100 employees with 90% of such employees earning less than Rs. 15000/-. As on 16<sup>th</sup> September, 2020, 2.79 lakh establishments claimed benefit for 44.42 lakh employees for which Rs.2224.52 crore has been credited.

Statutory PF contribution of both employer and employee has been reduced to 10% each from existing 12% each for all establishments covered by EPFO for three months.

To boost employment and livelihood opportunities for migrant workers returning to villages, in the wake of COVID-19 outbreak, Government of India has launched Garib Kalyan Rojgar Abhiyaan on 20th June 2020. Abhiyaan focuses on durable rural infrastructure and providing modern facilities like internet in the villages. Skill Mapping of the rural migrant labour being done to help them work closer home. The Abhiyaan involves intensified and focused implementation of 25 target driven works to provide employments and create infrastructure in the rural areas of 116 districts of 6 States with a resource envelope of Rs 50,000 crore to be implemented in a mission mode campaign in 125 days.

As per the information available, total employment generated (in days) under the Abhiyaan is 26,34,23,281 mandays with expenditure or Rs. 22761 crore as on 08.09.2020.

Government has also announced the measures to strengthen Infrastructure Logistics, Capacity Building, Governance and Administrative Reforms for Agriculture, Fisheries and Food Processing Sectors. These include Rs. 1 lakh crore Agri Infrastructure Fund for farm-gate infrastructure for farmers; Rs. 10,000 crore scheme for formalisation of Micro Food Enterprises; Rs. 20,000 crore for Fishermen through Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana; National Animal Disease Control Programme; Setting up of Animal Husbandry Infrastructure Development Fund of Rs. 15,000 crore; Promotion of Herbal Cultivation with an outlay of Rs. 4,000 crore; Beekeeping initiatives worth Rs. 500 crore; Measures for Governance and Administrative Reforms for Agriculture Sector; Amendments to Essential Commodities Act to enable better price realisation for farmers; Agriculture Marketing Reforms to provide marketing choices to farmers; Agriculture Produce Price and Quality Assurance.

Government of India has launched PM SVANidhi Scheme to facilitate collateral free working capital loan upto Rs.10,000/- of one-year tenure, to approximately, 50 lakh street vendors, to resume their businesses.

RBI and Government of India have also introduced measures to infuse liquidity in the economy to sustain the market economy.

#### **LOSS OF EMPLOYMENT TO DIFFERENTLY ABLED DURING COVID-19**

#### 1217. SHRI K.K. RAGESH:

Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether any measure to extend special financial support to the differently abled people are being considered who suffer loss of employment due to the COVID-19 pandemic;
- (b) If so, the details there of;
- (c) whether any allotment of any fund to various State Governments is under consideration; and
- (d) If so, the details there of?

#### **ANSWER**

## MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

(a) to (d): Government has taken several measures to ensure that the country is well prepared to face the challenges and threats posed by Covid-19 pandemic through various schemes extended to Differently Abled.

National Handicapped Finance and Development Corporation (NHFDC), a Public Sector Enterprise under Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment extended moratorium of three months on payment of loan (under the schemes viz "Divyangjan Swavalamban Yojana", Vishesh Micro Finance Yojana and "Small loan connect to PwDs for encouraging Self Help Group(SHG)") instalments outstanding with implementing agencies as per Reserve Bank of India guidelines. Government also extended the utilization period by another 120 days in respect of funds released to implementing agencies during the last quarter of last financial year 2019-20. To make differently abled employable and self-reliant, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities implements the National Action Plan for skilling of Persons with Disabilities.

Employees' State Insurance Corporation (ESIC) Act provides coverage to differently abled workers with a higher wage limit of Rupees 25000/- per month vis-a-vis wage limit of Rs 21000/- per month for non divyang workers. Employers' contribution for differently abled Insured Persons(IPs) is exempted for three years. Employees' State Insurance Corporation also provides relief for upto90 days in the form of Cash Compensation to the Insured Persons who become unemployed under Atal Beemit Vyakti Kalyan Yojana. During COVID-19 pandemic, the ESIC has enhanced quantum of benefit from 25% to 50% of average daily earning and relaxed the eligibility conditions for Insured Persons including differently abled IPs under Atal BeemitVyakti Kalyan Yojana for the period 24.03.2020 to 31.12.2020.

Government has also taken following steps to boost the employment opportunities for the workers including differently abled;

Government has announced an economic package of Rupees 20 lakh crore and advocated for Atmanirbhar Bharat which aims at creating jobs for the youth including Differently Abled.

Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana (PMGKY) is being implemented for the poor to mitigate the impact of COVID-19 pandemic. Under PMGKY, Government of India is contributing 12% employers' share and 12% employees share under Employees Provident Fund (EPF), totalling 24% for the wage month from March-August, 2020.

Statutory PF contribution of both employer and employee has been reduced to 10% each from existing 12% each for all establishments covered by EPFO for three months.

An Ex-gratia of Rs. 1,000 has been envisaged under PM Garib Kalayan package to 3 crore poor senior citizens, poor widows and poor disabled.

To boost employment and livelihood opportunities in the wake of COVID-19 outbreak, Government is implementing Garib Kalyan Rojgar Abhiyaan to provide internet, skill mapping facilities to the rural migrant workers including differently abled so as to find the work at their vicinity. The Abhiyaan involves intensified and focused implementation of 25 target driven works with a view to provide employment and create infrastructure in the rural areas of 116 districts of 6 States with a resource envelope of Rs 50,000 crore.

The MNREGA wage has been increased from Rs. 182 a day to Rs. 202to benefit 13.62 crore families including differently abled.

Government has also launched Prime Minister SVANidhi Scheme to facilitate collateral free working capital loan to approximately 50 lakh street vendors including differently abled.

- (a) & (b): As part of the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana (PMGKY) announced by the Government to address COVID-19 situation, the Employees' Provident Fund (EPF) Scheme has been amended to provide for a non-refundable advance from the provident fund account of a member not exceeding the basic wages and dearness allowances of that member for three months or up to 75% of the amount standing to his credit in the EPF Account, whichever is less. A statement showing State/UT-wise total number of claims for non-refundable (COVID) advance is at Annexure 'A'.
- (c): A statement showing State/UT-wise total amount withdrawn from EPFO (including COVID Advance) from lockdown to till date is at Annexure 'B'.

- (d)whether establishments are demanding for increasing it for one year in view of little improvement in the economic conditions; and
- (e)if so, whether any consultations between Minister of Finance and Minister of Labour Ministry held and if so, the details thereof?

#### **ANSWER**

## MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

- (a) to (c): Under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana(PMGKY), Government of India is contributing both 12% employees' share and 12% employers' share under Employees' Provident Fund (EPF), totaling 24% for the wage months of March, April and May, 2020, for all the establishments having up to 100 employees with 90% of such employees earning less than Rs.15,000/- monthly wage. The total estimated expenditure is Rs. 4860 crore. This will incentivize the said establishments to continue their employees on their payrolls despite disruptions due to COVID-19. Further, it will also provide liquidity relief to the establishments as they may continue to face financial crisis as they get back to work. A statement showing the benefits claimed under the PMGKY/Atmanirbhar Bharat by the establishments is annexed. This package was extended for another three months i.e., for the wage months of June, July and August, 2020 under the Atmanirbhar Bharat
- (d) & (e): There have been demands for extending the scheme further. For extension of any scheme involving financial implications consultation with Ministry of Finance is mandatory.

(a) & (b): The engagement of workers, contract labourers and others is governed by various labour laws which are implemented by the Central as well as the State Governments. In case of any complaint, grievance by any worker, the implementing agencies carry out inspection to enforce various rights envisaged in the Acts. In the Central Sphere, inspections are carried out by the Central Industrial Relations Machinery (CIRM), Employees' Provident Funds Organisation

and Employees' State Insurance Corporation for enforcement of various applicable labour laws. Action is taken against the defaulters/violators under the provisions of the applicable labour laws.

(c): The details of number of contract labourers engaged during the last five years in the Central Sphere based on the data of licences and registration certificate issued under the Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act, 1970 are as under:
